Modals of possibility and certainty

We use MAY, MIGHT and COULD when something is possible.

It may/might rain tomorrow

When we are sure that something certain, we use MUST

I have put on some weigh, I must lose some kilograms

When we are sure that something is not possible or is impossible, we use CAN'T

He doesn't answer the phone, he can't be at home
