## None – defining relative clause

• None – defining relative clause gives us extra information about someone or something.

**Ex:** John's mother , who lives in Scotland, has 6 grandchildren.

• If you remove the clause, the sentence will still make sense.

Ex: John's mother has 6 grandchildren.

• You can form None – defining relative clause :

Who	For people .
Whom	• The thief, who broke the windows of our houses, was dangerous.
Which	For things or animals .
	The horse, which we sold yesterday, was black and strong.
Where	For places .  • Cairo , where there are great historical places , is the capital of Egypt
When	For time.  • The year, when my family moved to another place, was 1990.

Note: None – defining relative clause is always separated from the rest of the sentence by commas or a comma or full stop.
